
Here are some general property maintenance housekeeping guidelines...

- Keep your roofs and exterior walls in sound condition.
- Gutters and downspouts should be kept free of debris and make sure they're attached to the house!
- Keep the mold and mildew off your exterior siding with frequent washings.
- When you're washing the walls...check for peeling and chipped paint and remember to touch these areas up also.
- Your yards, porches, and exterior areas should be kept free of trash and debris.
- Fences and gates should also be checked to make sure that they are in good working condition and not leaning or sagging.

ark your recreational vehicles in your side or rear yard. Semi –tractor parking in residential areas is not permitted! Please follow the other requirements in the zoning code.



atch leaving your inoperable vehicles, including vehicles with expired tags, on your property! Disabled vehicles should be stored in an enclosed garage or other accessory building.



TAKING OUT THE TRASH!!

Don't put out trash until the day before scheduled pickup.



Upholstered furniture and mattresses should be bagged. Trash cans should be stored on the side or rear of the property...not the front!
